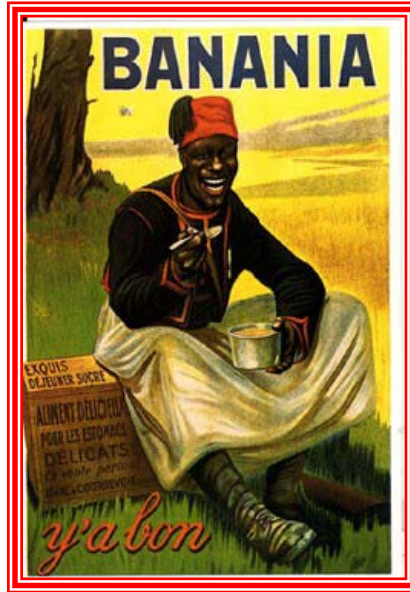


# *SAVE THE DATE!!!*
